#### Directions to Cove 2:

Follow I-5 South or North to exit 163 to the W. Seattle Freeway Exit

Take the W. Seattle Freeway West and get off at the Harbor Avenue Exit.

Follow Harbor Ave to the fishing pier.

Park in the fishing pier lot (Marination) parking lot if space is available. You can also park along Harbor Avenue.

If you drive past the Alki Boat launch or start curving around Alki Point back to the West, you've gone too far. If you enter Seacrest Park Cove 2 into Google Maps your phone will tell you how to get there.

appreciated as we got into our dry suits (those of us that were diving dry). Tide was out so it was a long walk to where it was deep enough to get fins on. Water in the shallows was crystal clear. Not so clear as we headed down the buoy line in search of the reef. Visibility was not too good but was good enough to keep track of buddies. On the way down there was a fried egg jellyfish floating upside down. Once hitting the bottom it was just a short swim to the pile of large rocks and cement pilings. During inspection of the reef ESSDB Peter found a large GPO in its den. There were a few large ling cod, a bunch of rock fish and three decorated warbonnets trying to hide between anemones on the pilings. The largest of the three was about 18" long. A couple of crabs were locked in battle when they fell off the rocks and landed upside down on the bottom. They laid there motionless as crabs tend to when upside down. Flicking them up with a finger allowed the battle to resume. It ended a few seconds later as one crab was able to escape and they faced each other with claws spread wide. After the dive a consensus decision was made to forgo the BBQ and head to El Reconcito for Mexican food. It was a really good dive on a beautiful day.

# Cool-?-of the Month Section Cool-Web-Articles-of-the-Month:

Our first cool web article for August is about the Gulper Eel, a deep sea eel that can unhinge its jaw and swallow large prey whole. Researchers at the Schmidt Ocean Institute found one of these eels that appeared to have recently had its dinner. You can read the article by clicking on <u>Gulper Eel</u>.

The second cool web article of the month about the world's largest freshwater fish. A freshwater stingray (an endangered species) was recently captured in the Mekong River in Cambodia that weighed in at 661 lb., making it the largest freshwater fish ever collected. Our third and final web article is not so cool. Beach water temperatures in Florida have exceeded 100 °F for several days in a row, setting a new temperature record. The Florida beach has reached temperatures usually maintained in hot tubs. This water temperature will not cool you off, but it also contributes to coral bleaching, having significant effects on the ecosystem.
