#### Directions to Edgewater Beach Park:

#### From the North:

Go S on I-5 to Exit 192 and turn right onto 41<sup>st</sup> St. In about 0.7 miles the road turns left and becomes Friday Ave and then E. Mukilteo Blvd. Continue on Mukilteo Blvd, for another 4 mi. and turn right on Mukilteo Lane.

Continue on Mukilteo Lane for about 0.4 mi. and turn right on Mt. Baker Ave, across the RR tracks. Turn right on  $1^{st}$  St. for almost a quarter mile and the park will be on your left.

#### From the **South**:

Go N on I-5 to Exit 182 and head West on Hwy 525.

After about 8.2 mi., turn right on  $1^{st}$  St. Follow  $1^{st}$  St. for about 0.6 mi. and the Park will be on your left.

Visibility wasn't fantastic, but we still managed to stay together and had a good time looking at all the life on the rock piles and beams out on the artificial reef. We saw many different rock fish and some very large ling cod. Frosted and opalescent nudibranchs were spotted in addition to two kelp crabs that managed to snag a large jellyfish and were happily munching on it. We are looking forward to the next time we return to this very nice dive site.

# Cool-?-of the Month Section Cool-Web-Articles-of-the-Month

Spanky found a cool web article about several sharks that are in danger of extinction. We hope that you have managed to see some of these sharks in your dive travles. You can read the article and see some short but very cool videos by clicking on <u>endangered sharks</u>.

The second cool-web-article-of-the-month is an interview with an eccentric dentist that became infatuated with narwals. He has become an expert on narwals (perhaps the world expert) and is actively involved in researching the animal. If you click on <u>narwal</u> you will learn what the narwal's tusk is used for.
