At the waterfront, bear left on Beach Drive and proceed to the 3-way stop just past Salty's.

Turn left and park along the street for free or in the pay lot to your right. Entry for the dive is across the street from the northwest corner of the parking lot. If you enter MaST Center Aquarium into Google Maps your ;phone will give you directions.
