ebruary Club Dive: Day Island

Our February dive will be in the South Sound at Day Island Wall. This is reportedly one of the best wall dives in Puget Sound. The site is known for lots of adult wolf eels and GPOs. It is very current-sensitive, so please try to be on time. We plan to meet bright and early at 8:00 AM on Saturday, February 3 and we need to enter no later than 9:00 AM. We will be prepared to call the dive in the unfortunate event that our crack dive planners may have missed the time for slack. Parking is limited and there are no facilities at the dive site, so please try to carpool and plan on making a pit stop before you arrive. After the dive we will head over to Boathouse 19 for lunch.

Directions to Day Island Wall:

From I-5 in Tacoma, take Highway 16 West toward the Tacoma Narrows Bridge. Before you get to the bridge, take the Jackson Street exit and turn left, heading south on S. Jackson. Turn right on 27th St. W, and follow it as it curves and becomes Vista before crossing the Day Island Creek bridge onto Day island. There are only two roads running N/S on Day Island (Day Island Blvd W and East Day Island Blvd W). Continue North until you reach the E/W road, 19th St. W. The beach access is across Day Island Blvd. W and 19th, on the West side of the island. Park along the street and please do not block access to any homes. You can also enter Day Island Wall dive site into Google maps and follow the directions on your phone.

Cool-?-of the Month Section Cool-Web-Articles-of-the-Month:


