# Cool-?-of the Month Section Cool-Web-Articles-of-the-Month:

Our first cool web article for this month was submitted by ESSDB Kim. The article describes how elephant seals get their shuteye during their multiple month sojourns into the open ocean. These amazing animals can reportedly dive to depths exceeding 5000 ft. You can read about it by clicking on elephant seals.

ESSDB DeeAnn submitted our second cool web article about a very colorful nudibranch that apparently is expanding its range into the waters around Great Britain. The Rainbow Nudibranch is just under an inch in length and is usually found in the warmer waters of southern Europe. It is likely moving north as waters warm due to climate change. A third cool web article was submitted by ESSDB Bart. Scientists studying a Brazilian reef octopus observed some unusual behavior that may suggest that their octopus was having a nightmare. Other researchers have evidence that octopuses may dream, but this is the first observation that suggests they may have nightmares. Spanky found a fourth cool (and quite long) web article that he is pretty sure will interest ESSDB Steve. Some recreational divers in the Baltic Sea off of Sweden discovered a wreck back in the 70s. Some 30 years later it was reported to an archeologist and the wreck was identified as a 500-year-old flagship that belonged to the King of Denmark.
