Parking at the lower parking area is also limited. Depending on how many divers will be going, we may need to shuttle gear between the upper and lower parking areas. If you plan on doing this dive, please RSVP to Spanky via email no later than Monday, April 29. Potential critters at this site include GPO's, rockfish, greenlings, and ling cod. After the dive we will drive over to the Village Pizzeria in Langley for lunch.

Directions to Possession Point:

You can enter Possession Point Dive Site into Google Maps and have it plot your route.

From the Clinton Ferry Terminal:

Head west on Hwy 525. At about 1.5 miles turn left onto Deer Lake Road.

At about 3.2 miles, turn left onto Cultus Bay Rd.

After about 2.1 miles, Cultus Bay Rd. turns to the right but you need to continue straight onto Possession Rd. Follow Possession Rd. for about 2 miles and take a right turn onto Franklin Rd. Take Franklin to its end and park in the narrow parking area. A few cars will be able to

pril Club Dive Report

Another beautiful, sunny day in Tacoma as five Intrepid Divers gathered at Les Davis Park to avail themselves of the stairs installed by the Washington SCUBA Alliance! Les Davis is not a current sensitive site, and yet we got in on time - probably due to being hungry and looking forward to the post dive meal. Regardless of the reason, we did a short surface swim to the 1st light pole, dropped down and headed north. We quickly came upon the 1st set of slabs and began exploring. There were some nice size perch hanging out and it was possible to get very close to them. Along the edge of anything that touched the bottom there was a phalanx of shrimp guarding their little slice of the third rock from the Sun. They're so cute when they charge! We also saw three good size Lemon Peels, a Northern Opalescent nudibranch, and the obligatory Ling Cod. Kim saw a Wolf

Eel that disappeared before she could get anyone's attention. It was a long dive even though we got down to 70 feet. Visibility was reasonable for Puget Sound - we were able to stay together by using our dive lights as beacons in the turbulent fog of Commencement Bay.

We will be holding this year's Dive/Camp Weekend on September 20 - 22. We have not yet finalized the location, but we are considering travelling north to Horseshoe Bay (Just north of Vancouver BC) for a weekend of boat dives in Howe Sound. If you have not yet done so, please RSVP now to Spanky to let him know you are interested.
