We found a cool web article about a large seamount that has recently been mapped by the Schmidt Ocean Institute. The seamount is located in international waters off the coast of Chile. It rises about 1.9 miles tall and is located in an underwater mountain range that includes a high level of biodiversity and some weird critters.
